The French Society of Rorschach was founded in 1950 by Cécile Beizmann, Daniel Lagache, and Jean Dublineau. In 1987, it became **The French-language Society of Rorschach and Projective Methods**, as several French-speaking members live outside of France (Algeria, Belgium, Canada, Spain, Italy, Japan, Lebanon, Mexico, Portugal, Switzerland, Turkey; amongst others).

After initially working on developing the projective tools by validating their theoretical foundations and organizing their teaching within universities, the Society now focuses on exchanges and perspectives related to conceptual advances and contemporary clinical issues.

Its members are psychologists who use projective tests in their clinical and research activities. They are eager to learn more and to be informed of scientific news. The symposia and congresses that are organized emphasize the articulation of theories, methods and practices of projective tests with children, adolescents, and adults, particularly in the fields of psychopathology, school psychology, from the diagnosis and therapeutic analysis, in institutions or in private practices, from clinical variations of the normal to serious disorders requiring long care.

Field practitioners, psychology students and university lecturers/researchers exchange ideas on the models of interpretation of projective tests, their questions, difficulties and opportunities. Together, they defend the practice of the Rorschach and the other projective methods and counter their dissemination and excessive vulgarization with a concern for ethical respect for both the framework of their uses and the subjects encountered.

Membership in the French-Language Rorschach Society is possible for all psychologists as well as second-year students of a Masters program or an equivalent degree.

It allows one to benefit from a preferential rate for the symposia of the Society and its partners. Members of the Rorschach Society may also be members of the International Society of Rorschach and Projective Methods and benefit from a subscription to the *Rorschachiana* journal in addition to a preferential rate for participation in the Congresses of The International Society of Rorschach.
